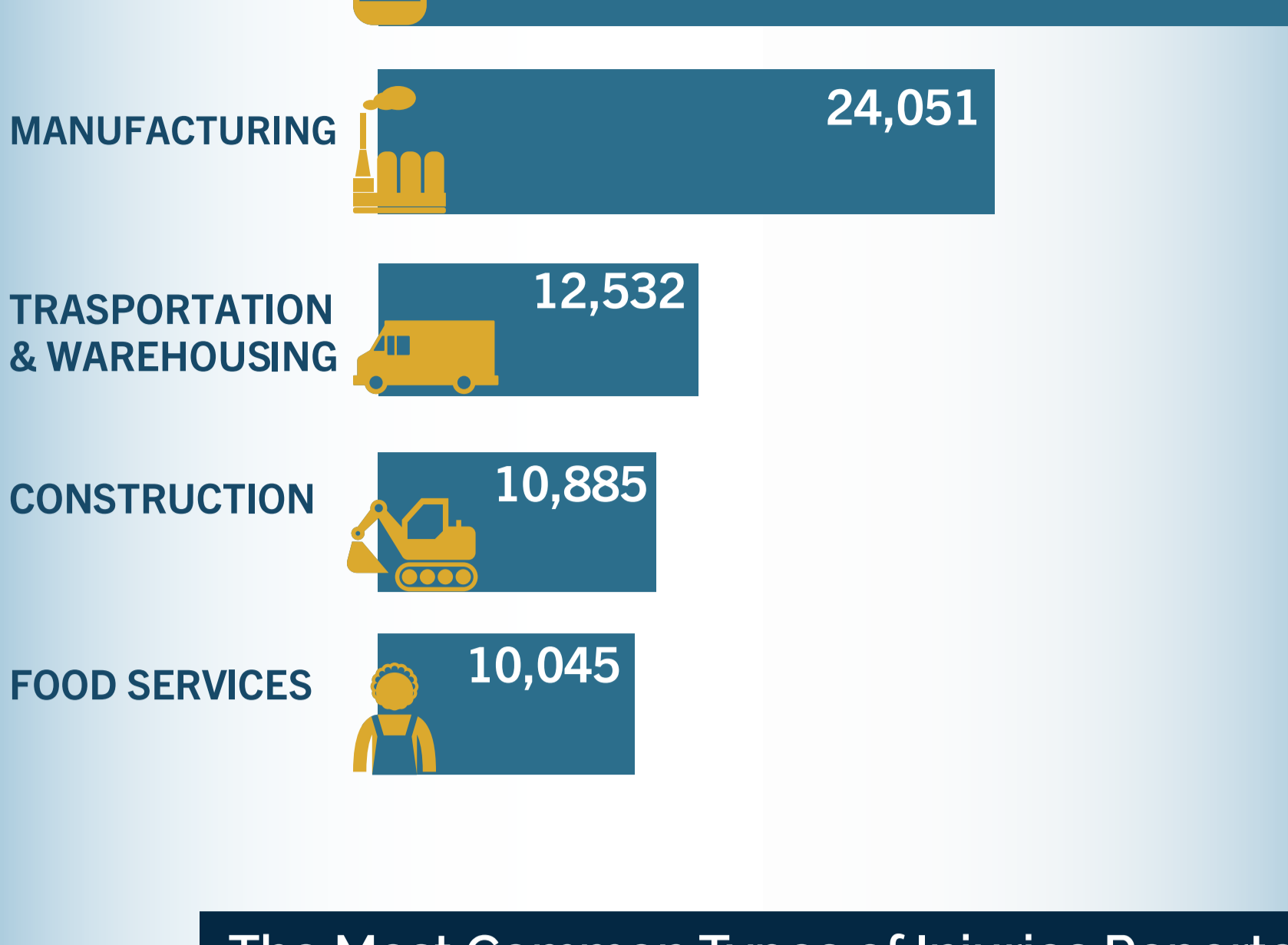

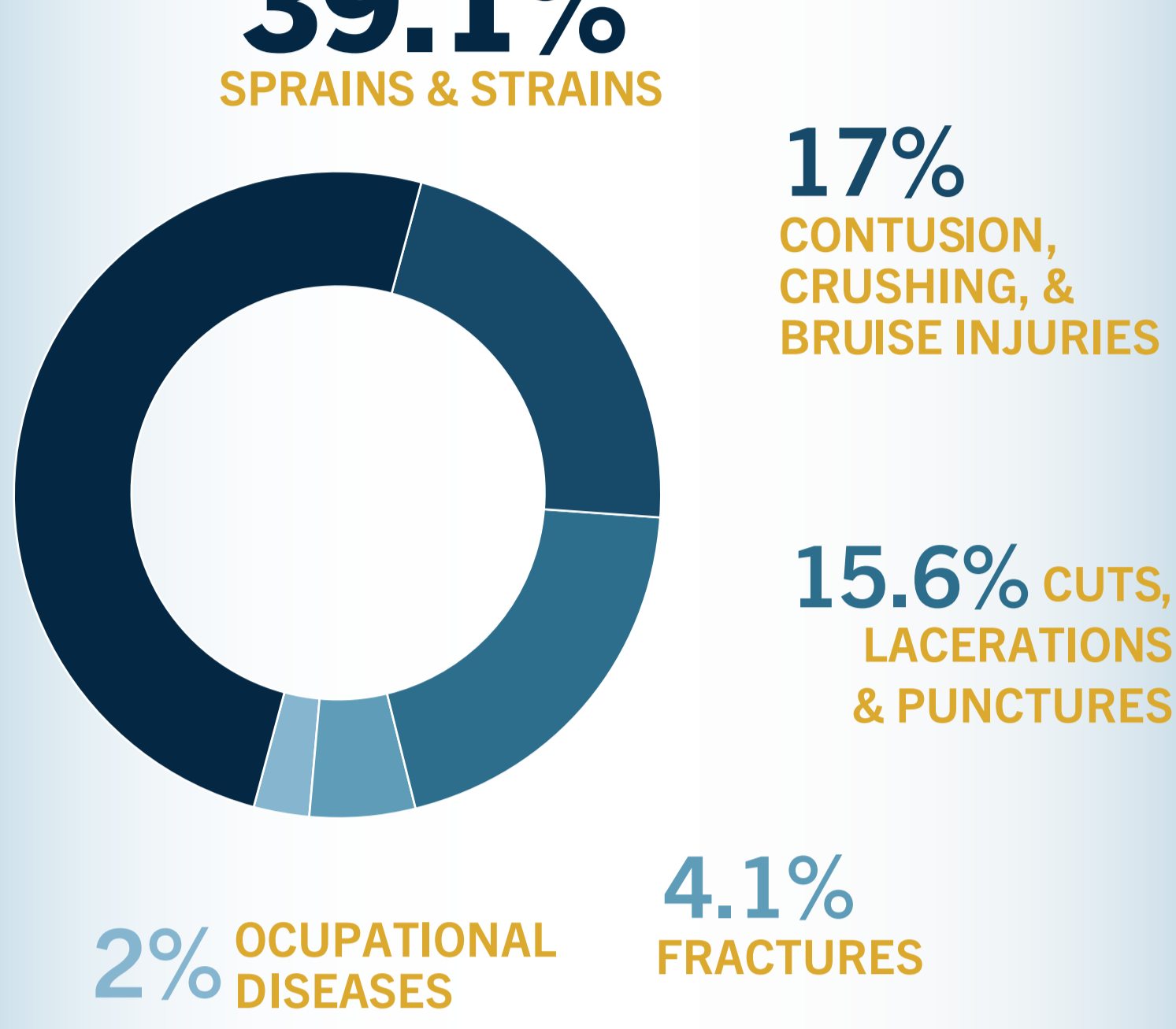

The Most Dangerous Types of Jobs in 2014



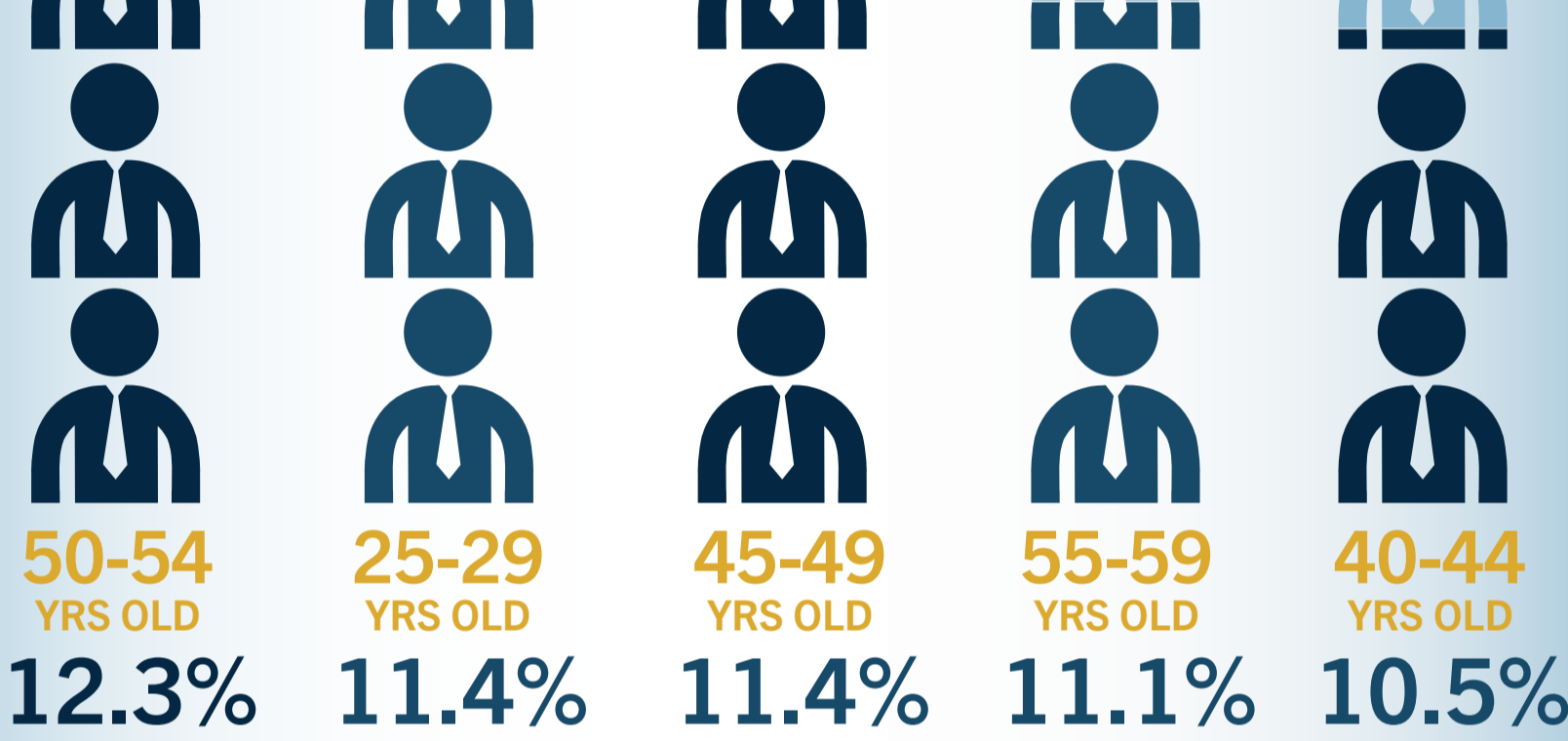
The Most Common Types of Injuries Reported

Types of Benefits Available to Injured Workers in Pennsylvania

- REPLACEMENT OF LOST WAGES
- PAYMENT OF MEDICAL EXPENSES
- SPECIFIC LOSS BENEFITS
- DISFIGUREMENT BENEFITS
- DEATH BENEFITS
- SUBSEQUENT INJURIES

How the Workers' Compensation System Works

STEP 1 Report your injury to your employer

Fill out form **LIBC-500** to document injury or illness

STEP 2

STEP 3

Employer reports your injuries to insurer and files a **First Report of Injury** to the Bureau of Workers' Compensation

STEP 4

Employer or insurance carriers issue a **Notice of Workers' Compensation Payable**, a **Notice of Temporary Compensation Payable** or an **Agreement for Compensation** to injured worker
